Word problems involving capacity

Example 1: A drum contains 96 litres of kerosene. John adds 58 litres of kerosene to it. How much kerosene is there in the drum?

Solution:

The drum contains.      96 litres of kerosene

John adds.                +58 litres of kerosene

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The drum now has.      154 litres of kerosene

Example 2: A truck has 205 litres of diesel in its tank. 50 litres of diesel were used for a journey. How much diesel is left in the tank?

Solution:

The tank contains.      205 litres of diesel

The driver used.        - 50 litres of diesel

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The tank now has.      155 litres of diesel

Now do these:

1. A bucket can hold 10 litres of water and a bowl can hold 8 litres. How much water can both the containers hold?
2. Mrs Jimoh had 26 litres of kerosene and Mrs Mary had 32 litres. How much kerosene do both of them have?
3. A drum contains 85 litres of water. Emeka uses 36 litres for washing clothes. How much water is left in the drum?
4. What is the difference between 142 litres and 108 litres?
5. Find the sum of 23 litres, 48 litres and 16 litres
6. Mrs. Malaika had 36 litres of milk. She used 19 litres for baking. How much milk is she left with?
7. Tank A contains 156 litres of kerosene and Tank B contains 128 litres. How much kerosene can both tanks hold?
